ETHICS AND THE CLOSURE OF HUMANITARIAN PROJECTS PHASE ONE (ECPI)

In this phase, we conducted a scoping literature review, interviewed national and international humanitarian workers, and developed an ethics guidance note for project closure in humanitarian action.
